Notes from Fr. Tom

Dear Loyola Parishioners & Visitors,

Grace sought: “spiritual freedom.”

Texts:

First, our [Ignatian spirituality] requires of all of us **Total Detachment** from places, jobs, positions, privileges (such as seniority, stability, tenure). We must have, rather, unconditional willingness to serve the Gospel and the Church.

Our [spirituality] also demands **Total Immersion** in the environment, work and context of the mission. This is an essential condition for finding deep joy in the mission, and for contributing creatively to its needs.

Finally, our [spirituality] requires full acceptance of the fact our mission is far greater than what any single individual, group, community or congregation can aim. That is why we need a spirit of **Total Cooperation** with others, be they lay persons, diocesan clergy, other religious or even people from other faith traditions. [This] invites us to a great community spirit: an ability, always fresh, to work with others, *as a team*, without any desire for position, recognition or privileges, because our source of joy is the call of the Lord to serve.

- What experiences as a servant of the Lord help me to recognize the value of total detachment, total immersion, and total cooperation? Why were they fruitful experiences?
- What personal experiences in Loyola parish underscore the value of total detachment, total immersion, and total cooperation? How will each of us laboring out of these values help the parish on our mission today and possibly on a new mission tomorrow?
- What is my experience of being called by the Lord to serve? How was that call made known?
