**Notes from Fr. Tom**

Dear Loyola Parishioners & Visitors,

Today's first reading from *Genesis* hits home with many, if not all of us, except I frequently find myself pleading for God's wrath upon evildoers rather than God's mercy on behalf of the innocent, in this case but not all cases, who no doubt would suffer and die as well. I don't think about the fact I have been shown mercy and have been spared God's wrath for my own evil doing so that I might have a chance to change. In truth, as Clint Eastwood's character said in *Unforgiven*, "Kid, we all have it coming."

Today's reading from *Genesis* reminded me of what Cardinal Walter Kasper has written about God's mercy:

In his mercy, God rather holds back his justified wrath; indeed, he holds himself back. He does this in order to provide people the opportunity for conversion. Divine mercy grants sinners a period of grace and desires their conversion. Mercy is ultimately the grace for conversion.

God's mercy...bursts the logic of human justice, which entails the punishment and death of the sinner. God's mercy desires life. God mercifully reestablishes the relationship with him that was destroyed by sin and he grants dependable living conditions anew.

Again and again, God calms his righteous holy wrath and shows mercy to his errant people, despite their infidelity, in order to give them another chance for repentance and conversion. He is the protector and preserver of the poor and those without rights.

Throughout history, there have been periods when individuals and nations have cried out to God to act, to intervene, in the atrocities being committed against other human beings. Periods of genocide. Periods of apartheid. Periods of civil war. God did not destroy cities, nations, peoples rather in post-period times, future generations have sought to reconcile and turn away from the evil ways of the present and previous generations. Our faith is that God is found in these slow, evolutionary changes in human behavior, attitudes, ways of living in community. We are not there yet, but as a human species we are evolving towards right relationship between one another and between ourselves and God even if we profess no belief in God. God is nonetheless at work.
