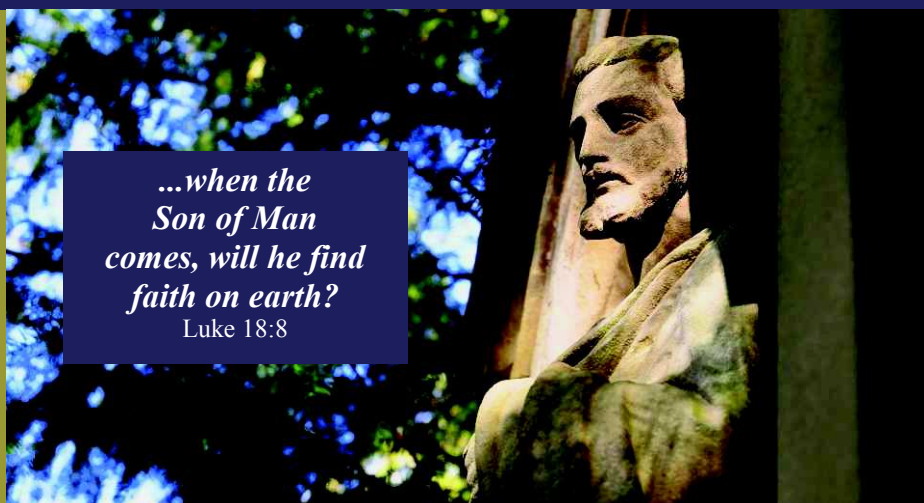

## ACCOMPANYING THE JESUITS AT GENERAL CONGREGATION 36

This week the Congregation delegates prayed for the grace of discernment as they prepared to elect a New Superior General. Similarly, our Loyola "innovation teams" and Magis Leadership Team are asked to prayerfully deliberate over the matters before them, choosing not what seems expedient or easily presents itself; but rather, that which, the Holy Spirit, seems to be calling or directing them and our parish.

## The Grace of Discernment

*Excerpt from morning prayer for October 10, 2016.*

"We decided to come together for some days before separating, to discuss with one another our vocation and manner of life. After doing this for several days, we were divided by different ideas and opinions concerning our state of life. There was unity of mind and purpose: to seek the gracious and perfect will of God according to the scope of our vocation; but there were various opinions concerning the more effective and more successful means, both for ourselves and for our fellowmen. (...) Finally, we decided affirmatively, namely, that since the most kind and loving Lord had deigned to unite us to one another and to bring us together – weak men and from such different places and cultures – we should not sever God's union and his bringing us together, but rather every day we should strengthen and more solidly ground it, forming ourselves into one body". Deliberation of the First Fathers [Leading to the Founding of the Society of Jesus]

We, trusting that he will give us the grace necessary to fulfill this vocation, commit ourselves anew to following the promptings of the Holy Spirit, so that we may seek diligently the will of God, and discern well and freely that which is before us, so that our whole life and everything we do, both individually and corporately, may correspond to our call. Trusting in God's assistance, we renew our plea for the gift of discernment, so that we may choose what is best, what is in accord with the greatest love, and what will bring Our Lord the greatest glory.

*Excerpt from morning prayer for October 13, 2016.*

"It is necessary to keep as my objective the end for which I am created, to praise God our Lord and save my soul. Furthermore, I ought to find myself indifferent, that is, without any disordered affection, to such an extent that I am not more inclined or emotionally disposed toward taking the matter proposed rather than relinquishing it, nor more toward relinquishing it rather than taking it. Instead, I should find myself in the middle, like the pointer of a balance, in order to be ready to follow that which I shall perceive to be more to the glory and praise of God our Lord and the salvation of my soul. I should beg God our Lord to be pleased to move my will and to put into my mind what I ought to do in regard to the matter proposed, so that it will be more to his praise and glory. I should beg to accomplish this by reasoning well and faithfully with my intellect, and by choosing in conformity with his most holy will and good pleasure." Ex. Sp. 179-180
