**Notes from Fr. Tom**

Dear Loyola Parishioners & Visitors:

**BREAKING NEWS:**

*Rene Lima-Marin, who was mistakenly released decades early from a 98-year sentence only to be sent back to prison three years ago after starting a family, was ordered released from prison Tuesday by a judge who called his being re-incarcerated "utterly unjust."*

*"Requiring Lima-Marin to serve the rest of his prison sentence all these years later would be draconian, would deprive him of substantive due process, and would perpetrate a manifest injustice," Chief Arapahoe County District Judge Carlos Samour Jr. wrote. "Because the Court finds that Lima-Marin is being unlawfully detained, he is ordered released. No other remedy will result in justice in this case."*

So, you may have read Tuesday afternoon in the Denver Post. This is one reason why I am so excited parishioner Celesté Martinez, who is both a Regis University graduate and community organizer with Together Colorado, is continuing to explore and develop a relationship between the parish and Together Colorado. Together Colorado took a lead role in organizing for the release of Rene Lima-Marin. Together Colorado is an inter-faith organization that puts us in partnership with other clergy and lay people of various faiths. Through Together Colorado, I can meet regularly with clergy and leaders of various faith communities.

For those who were part of the parish examen discussions, I think you will agree that Together Colorado offers us an opportunity to address some of the questions raised regarding our involvement in faith that does justice and collaboration and inter-faith/ecumenical alliances.

I will be taking some time this week to reflect further on the calls we heard as a parish and commitments we may be invited to make.

**P.S. Wednesday**

When Rene Lima-Marin was released, Immigration Customs Enforcement came to pick him up. Rene is originally from Cuba, and due to his felony charges, he was given a notice of deportation by ICE. Since Rene was not a priority for deportation, he was regularly attending ICE check-ins to resolve his immigration case. When Rene was re-incarcerated due to the clerical error in 2014, he was forced to miss his last ICE check-in of that year. Together Colorado is already mobilizing to stop the deportation.
