Notes from Fr. Tom

Dear Loyola Parishioners & Visitors:

A few years ago, due to the generosity of an anonymous
donor, I and 8 other priests had the opportunity to complete a
two-year Catholic Leadership training program.
Consequently, I receive a monthly newsletter which features
graduates of the program. The July issue featured the pastor
of St. Monica's parish who had engaged with 23 parishioner-
participants in a parish-sponsored "Parish Missionary
Disciples" program facilitated by trainer-consultants from the
Catholic Leadership Institute which provided the priests'
training I attended.

The St. Monica's parishioners were asked a couple questions
like those we were asked to consider in our Province-designed
Parish Examen in April. Both the Parish Missionary Disciples
program and the Parish Examen were parts of a discernment
method set up to prayerfully consider the present and future of
their parishes. For Loyola, the two unifying questions for the
set of reflections and questions presented were: what is the
present state of the Jesuit identity of the parish, and what is the
future Jesuit identity of the parish desired. So, the two similar
questions asked were: "If St. Monica [St. Ignatius of Loyola]
closed tomorrow – besides the parishioners – who would miss
us?"

The second was: "What impact do you hope the program
[Jesuit identity] will have on church leaders?" St. Monica's
parishioners' response to the question was: "First: find and
identify them. We certainly have people who are 'active' but
are they true 'leaders?' Are they 'disciples?' Second: help
determine where people are in their respective spiritual faith
journey and provide the support to help move them into and
through the higher spiritual 'thresholds'." In our first session,
the question of who are the parish leaders came up. It was
pointed out people may oversee various ministries or have
personal interests they act upon independent of the parish or
responsibilities for organizing things, but it is not clear all in
leadership positions are leaders. The issue of missionary
disciples—being disciples ourselves and disciple-makers—
also emerged. Many wanted a deeper familiarity with Ignatian
spirituality and formation.

In my report to the Province I stated one of our goals for this
year and coming years was to offer opportunities for
leadership development and training as well as Ignatian
spirituality and formation to parishioners. I just found my
own training very helpful, even if I don't apply it well, and I
am grateful to the benefactor who provided us all a cost-free
experience except for our own transportation expense.
